



Celebration of New Ministry

1. The Service for the Celebration of New Ministry must be the one that has been authorized for use by the Bishop of Huron.

(Changes in the Service may be made only in Consultation with the Bishop)

2. The Territorial Archdeacon shall set the date of the Service for the Celebration of New Ministry in consultation with the Rector/Priest-in-Charge and the Regional Dean.
3. The Rector will invite the Preacher for the Service after consultation with the Bishop or Territorial Archdeacon. Preachers who do not hold a Licence or General Permit of the Bishop of Huron require the Bishop's permission to preach at a service in the Diocese of Huron.
4. The Rector/Priest-in-Charge shall be responsible for inviting the clergy of the deanery and other denominations. **It is the practice of the diocese that deanery clergy attend the Service and vest accordingly.**
5. It is the responsibility of the Rector/Priest-in-Charge and Churchwardens to arrange for adequate seating in the church for the Service, and to reserve seating for invited clergy and participants. The Rector/Priest-in-Charge and Churchwardens shall sit in the front row of the nave. During the Service, no one should be seated in the Incumbent's prayer desk until he/she is installed in it. Other clergy may be seated in choir stalls or in the front rows of the nave.
6. It is advisable for the Rector/Priest-in-Charge, Churchwardens and Servers to have a rehearsal prior to the Service.
7. The Regional Dean shall read the Licence of the Bishop at the appropriate point in the service and shall hand it to the Incumbent/Priest-in-Charge.

The Bishop of Huron has authorized the service of Celebration of New Ministry as composed by the Doctrine and Worship Committee for use in the Diocese of Huron. This service expresses the spirit marking the beginning of a new ministry. It seeks to emphasize the concept of ministry which belongs to all the baptized, and so it includes an exchange of covenants between the priest and the community.

A. Notes concerning the service

1. The readers of the Old and New Testament lessons may be members of the congregation.
2. When the order of the Holy Communion from the *Book of Common Prayer* is used, the Lord's Prayer may be said or sung after the Prayer of Consecration. The Intercessions, Comfortable Words and the *Gloria in Excelsis* may be omitted.



3. If is a celebration of the Holy Eucharist, the celebrant shall be the newly inducted Rector/Priest-in-Charge
4. At the Eucharist, the Holy Gospel shall be read by a priest or deacon.
5. It is most appropriate that the Service take place within the first month of the appointment of the new Rector/Priest-in-Charge. However, due to the nature of the calendar, the weather or other mitigating factors, this celebration may be delayed for a number of months.

B. Readings and Psalms suitable for the Celebration of a New Ministry

Holy oil, through which the healing Holy Spirit comforts the faithful in times of infirmity and Sacred Chrism which anoints the newly baptized and the newly ordained priests and bishops. Here too are the sacred Scriptures, with which you must nourish the flock entrusted to your care, and the prayer books by which we sing our praises and seek the mercy of God. Receive these tools and use them to build up the people of God in this place.

Induction of an Incumbent or Priest in Charge

In the case of the Induction of a Priest-in-Charge or one carrying a title other than Rector, the formulas appearing above simply replace the word "Rector" with "Incumbent" or "Priest-in-Charge"
